The First Sunday in Lent

February 21, 2010

We greet you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Whoever you are and wherever you are in your journey of faith, you are welcome in this community celebrating God's Spirit in the world.

God's grace meets us in the water and Word, and in the bread and wine. We are here to know again the touch of God's forgiveness and love and to hear God's calling in our lives.



VISUAL ART this morning is *Christ in the Desert* (1939, tempera on hardwood, 122 x 169 cm) by Gustave van de Woestyne (Belgium, 1881-1947).

Harry Gielen has written, “The painting of *Christ in the Desert* confronts us with a majestic figure which dominates the whole desert and its horizon. The stillness of the landscape is absorbed into the motionless attitude of the body. The size of the eyes is striking and they appear to look toward different worlds in bewilderment and amazement and questioning. At the same time they somehow evoke the majestic look of the Pantocrator Christ in Byzantine and early Romanesque paintings and sculptures. The enigmatic gesture of the hands adds to the impression of mystery that hovers over the whole painting. Christ is dressed in a seamless garment whose soft white colour contrasts with the golden light of the desert sand. The light suggests the pure splendour of Easter morning, which leaves no place for the devil and the anecdotal temptation scenes.

“In this painting, van de Woestyne is revealing his own personal experience, that human existence at its deepest level cannot avoid facing solitude. He invites the spectator to identify with him.

“Gustave van de Woestyne was only eighteen when he joined the first group of artists who, in the last years of the nineteenth century, established themselves in Sint-Martens-Latem, a small Flemish village not far from Ghent. During the ten years that he stayed there he was profoundly influenced by the collegial discussions on cultural and spiritual matters that initially bound these artists together.

“At a decisive moment in 1905, he made the option of entering the novitiate of a Belgian Benedictine abbey but had to give up his experiment after three months. The rest of his life, however, continued to be marked by a deep spiritual and religious search that is reflected in many of his paintings.”

MARKS OF THE CHRISTIAN

“Book of Faith Lenten Journey: Marks of the Christian” by David L. Miller will be our Lent devotion this year. This book invites you into a daily personal devotional time for each of the 40 days of Lent, beginning Ash Wednesday, Feb. 17. There are not devotions for Sundays, which are for worship with the community. The devotions are reflections on Romans 12:1-15, and a word or “mark” for each day. You are encouraged to read, reflect, pray, and keep a journal. The book is available from the church office M, T, Th, Fr. and Sundays. We ask for a \$10 donation to cover the cost of this book.

You may take this journey alone or with others. Setting aside a weekly time for conversation on these “marks” and on your prayer and journals will be an encouragement in faith. There will be sign-up sheets at Advent at the beginning of the month for forming small groups for this purpose. Another possibility is covenanting with one or more people in your household, such as your spouse, to set aside time each week, or even each day, for sharing this journey. Another possibility is having a prayer and journey partner from another part of the state, country, or world, with whom you covenant to share this journey. How are you being led to share this journey of faith, and with whom?

1st Quarter Mission 2010

On February 7, 2010, representatives from Santa Cruz al Salvador will present a Minute for Mission at both services and give a longer presentation during the 9:30 a.m. Adult Sunday School session. Kent Madsen, president of the Executive Board, and other members of the group will provide an in-depth program setting out the history, progress and goals of this “people to people” mission program serving our brothers and sisters in El Salvador.

Over the past 15 years, Santa Cruz al Salvador has generated more than \$350,000 in funds which have supported both community development and education for Ciudadela Doctor Guillermo Ungo, a rural area that also includes ten small hamlets radiating out from the center of Guillermo Ungo, site of both a health clinic and a school serving grades kinder through high school.

On its recent trip in November, the group was instrumental in presenting 120 scholarships to students from these communities. A scholarship of \$60.00 for elementary and \$95.00 for high school students provides a uniform, shoes, textbooks, supplies and daily lunch for an entire year of study. A scholarship of \$125.00 assists with tuition and books for technical school and university students. A delegation of California health professionals offered two clinic days to augment the services of the local doctor, whose monthly salary of \$500.00 is paid by the organization.

GOSPEL OF LUKE GRACE AND FORGIVENESS



Saint Luke

Since Luke was an earlier companion of St. Paul, he knew a great deal about Jesus' teachings. Luke was well suited to share his understandings of the gospel message with other Gentiles.

Luke's gospel is the first book of a two volume work: the gospel itself and the Acts of the Apostles. Luke addresses both of them to the same person, Theophilus, whose name means "lover of God."

Luke probably wrote his gospel between A.D. 80 and 85. Luke's Jesus is filled with mercy and compassion. Jesus shows a special tenderness for the afflicted and oppressed. He respects everyone and defends the dignity of all. Luke known as the Evangelist.
